#### Intro

#### Purpose

NIH RePORTER APIs are designed to programmatically expose relevant scientific awards data from both NIH and non-NIH federal agencies for the consumption of project teams or external 3rd party applications to support reporting, data analysis, data integration or to satisfy other business needs as deemed pertinent.

#### Audience

Primary focus groups consist of developers, solution architects, and technical architects. Business users such as CIOs, program managers, project managers or other technology executives are another potential audience who might be interested in understanding the value of NIH RePORTER API for their projects before involving their technical teams.

#### **API Endpoints**

For the endpoints supported by the NIH RePORTER APIs, the interface below lists the payload criteria that can be used to retrieve the relevant data in JSON format. You can enter a valid value for one or more criteria parameter and click the "Try it Out" button. System will return:

- Curl script for executing the API using a command line interface (CLI).
- · The Response Body showing the actual data.
- Request URL, Request Headers, and Response Headers with relevant information.

## NIH RePORTER Update



- Valuable Data: All NIH grants back to 1985; most extensive source
- Backstory (2018)
  - Federal RePORTER API, but no NIH RePORTER API
  - NIH ExPORTER downloadable Microsoft Excel spreadsheets
- Original Algorithm
  - Download entire NIH RePORTER database in Excel every Monday
  - Search the spreadsheets line-by-line for your names and institutions
  - Import Exporter spreadsheets into Flight Tracker/REDCap
  - Handled by Flight Tracker's computational system
- Very much imperfect; helped by duplication with Federal RePORTER







#### Goals

- Hook up NIH RePORTER API to new REDCap form (NIH RePORTER)
- Hook up new form to Flight Tracker's computation engine
- Write hookup in a way that will enable quick and easy searching for both RePORTERs in the future **instant searching**
- Stress-test hookup with new internal project with Rebecca to debug
- Preserve old ExPORTER data & add new NIH RePORTER data
- Search by PI (or co-PI) name and institution



- Abstracts
- COVID flag
- → These new fields will be leveraged by future development down the road...







- REDCap Administrator upgrades to Flight Tracker Version 2.34.1 (out now)
- 2. Update your data dictionary on the Flight Tracker Home page.
- 3. Then the NIH ExPORTER will be turned off and the NIH RePORTER API will be turned on.
- 4. Will continue to auto-update every Monday morning at midnight.







Dreams for RePORTER system from Flight Tracker:


- NIH RePORTER searchable API

#### What's New?



#### **Missingness Report**

- Under View menu
- Finds where holes in data exist measures completeness
- Facilitates targeted data collection efforts, especially before reporting statistics to outside groups
- Developed early in Flight Tracker efforts → not as beautified
- Added dates of last contact; made more graphically appealing

#### **State of Missing Data**

#### Propose changing the following concerning degrees:

- 1. On Manual Degree form, provide list of all possible degrees, including bachelor's degrees
- 2. On summary form, MD → MD or equivalent; PhD → PhD or equivalent; etc.
- 3. Add checkbox list of all degrees
- 4. Institutions: Include institutions on Manual Degree form in institution list (in addition to Position Change form)

(Proposed by Vanderbilt MSCI program)

#### What's Next?

#### **Position Change and Manual Degree forms**

- Repeating REDCap forms
- Used to track career progression, especially outside of your institution





#### What's Next?



#### **Proposed Change in Categories of Race**

- Add "More than one race" to options
- Text sometimes, but not always, used by federal government
- Preferred over multi-racial
- Goal is to map to federal, especially NIH, categories
   (Proposed by Krista Metz of the University of Cincinnati)








#### **Proposed changes in Grant Wrangling: Common mismatched name(s)**

- Flight Tracker lives and dies by matching by name and by institution
- ORCID hopefully supplanting over time, but not "there" yet
- Sometimes, names mismatch within your institution
- E.g., at Vanderbilt, Harold Moses and Harold Moses, Jr. Or also at Vanderbilt, Marion (Lee) Sanders and Michael Lee Sanders



- → Add an "exclude list" to the Grant Wrangler a list of names to exclude from matching
- → Also, delete old matches from exclude list





#### **Current Grant-Viewing Options in Flight Tracker:**

- Stylized CDA table views career trajectory among major awards
- Uses definition of \$250k/year for 3+ years for R01-Equivalent
- Reflected on Summary form
- BUT excludes smaller awards that may represent significant professional steps, especially among trainees of training grants






#### What's Next?
